2009: Returned to Jacksonville and assumed leadership of First Coast Freedom League (FCFL) and the Triangle Trio leagues; consolidated them into a single league that later joined IGBO.

2009: Founded RIOT to strengthen Jacksonville's presence within IGBO.

2011: Attended my first IGBO Annual (Columbus, OH).

2011: Attended my first IGBO Mid-Year (Rochester, NY).

2011: Launched Hungover Mondays, which later became part of IGBO.

2012: Directed Menopause the Tournament and hosted the event in Jacksonville.

2009–2013: Served as RIOT Director.

2014: Directed IGBO Mid-Year.

2016: Served as Co-Chair, IGBO Tournament Forum.

Fall 2019: Reorganized FCFL and rejoined IGBO. Serve as President.

Fall 2019–present: Became Co-Director of RIOT for the 2020 tournament year and continue to serve. RIOT grew to 332 bowlers in 2025, with a goal of 384 in 2026.

Fall 2019: Supported the relaunch of Menopause the Tournament, now known as MENO/MANO.

2020–present: Serve as Co-Director of MENO/MANO.

2023: Served as Hospitality Chair for IGBO Annual 2024.

2024: Elected Director at Large at IGBO Annual (Reno).

Community impact: NFAN (North Florida AIDS Network) donations have exceeded \$25,000 in cash and food contributions.

Community impact: Led a 2023 coat drive that collected more than 300 coats for local schools and Lutheran Social Services.

Community impact: Led a 2023 RIOT food drive benefiting Lutheran Social Services.

2024: Began exploring hosting IGBO Annual and submitted a Letter of Intent for IGBO Annual 2028; we will present our bid in Denver in 2026.
